What a Ghoul is seen - a woman -

She frequently stood in one of the windows  
of this Mill<sup>Brick</sup>, & Room (that is a picture  
of the Windmill, and with abundance of  
nice rooms as is common in Europe)  
and in the first story thereof.

One half of this Ghoul stood outside  
one in a glazed window of the first floor of the house  
of the Wimondre; the other half inside,  
She stood upon the sill of the window  
and the window being cloud,  
one half of her person being within the house  
and the other half on the outside  
thereof.

The Wimondre ~~sash~~ being cloud  
the less and this Abominable Standey  
met, one half of her person was  
within the house and the other, outside  
thereof, while hundreds of people  
stood in the street, looking at her.
